






Cumulative share of income


Problems with inequality statistics


- Sampling frame: Is it up to date?
- Size of the sample: varies in the region from a few hundred to 15,000
- Measuring/comparing income and consumption
- Under-representation of the poor and rich
- Under-representation of mobile people
- Seasonality




Development Myth #6 Within country income distribution become more unequal as countries get richer.
