



Vietnam's Modernization Track

Theoretically, Vietnam has pursued...

- Import Substitution (Protection)
- 2. Catch-up Economy (competitive sector)
- Leading Fundamental Science and Technology Sector

With limited funds and resources – Vietnam has paid attention to 1 and 2 options










Dimensions of "McDonaldization"


Traditional vs. Modern

Dominant Characteristics	Tradition	Modernity
Technology	Animate Power Agriculture Mechanistic	Non-animal power Industry Organic (complex)
Outcomes	Rural Low life expectancy	Urban High life expectancy
Attitudes	Gemainschaft "established belief in the sanctity of immemorial traditions"	Gessellschaft "rational authority, belief in the legality of patterns of normative rules"
Division of labor Legal Standard Identity	Diffuse roles Particularistic values Collective	Specific roles Universalistic Self orientation

Socio-Cultural

 Traditional values block a country from developing e.g. valuing the extended family, blocks geographical mobility (Talcott Parsons)

Collectivism	Individualism




Self Expression Va Factor Score


Economic Modernization

 W. W. Rostow (1960) *The Stages of Economic Growth:* Five stages of economic growth (traditional society – 2nd stage (pre-take off) – 3rd stage (the take off) – 4th stage (the drive to maturity, extend modern tech) – 5th state (high-mass consumption)

 Assumed that composed of stages are shared by 'all' countries – a homogenizing process, replicate European / North American values and worldviews.

 Irreversible process, progressive & transformative process (not revolutionary)





Karl Deutsch

 K. Deutch (1961) "Social Modernization" – the process in which major clusters of old social, economic, and psychological commitments are eroded.

> Through exposure to modernity: Mass Media, Voting, Urbanization, Non-agricultural employment, literacy, per capital income, etc.


New patterns of socialization and sociopolitical behavior

Several others: Anti-corruption, flexible labor, WTO agreements, Social safety Nets, Poverty Reduction, etc.

Developing Nations and Modernization

 Western investment in factories, expertise and equipment – use loans from World Bank, IMF, Western aid organizations

 Western funding to introduce meritocratic education (values of universalism, individualism, and competition).

Dissemination of modern ideas via mass media, academics, tourism, etc.
