Thuan province, a rising region with tourism, thermal electricity, and agricultural potential in Central Vietnam.

As part of our admission activities for the MPP Program in 2020, Open Day and Demo Classes in HCMC took place in late June, attracting around 150 prospective candidates to Crescent Campus to discuss with FSPPM leadership and alumni on the value of the program and how an education in public policy elevates their knowledge and career prospects. Participants could register for the two Demo Classes by two FSPPM senior faculty, Prof. Pham Duy Nghia and Dr. Le Thai Ha.


# MPP2020 (Leadership and Management) Thesis defense

In May, nineteen out of twenty-four MPP2020-LM (Leadership and Management concentration) students successfully defended their master's theses and met graduation requirements for the master's degree. Graduation thesis can be a policy analysis research or a capstone research project demonstrating practicality in addressing issues and challenges encountered by an institute or organization.

## MPP2021 field trip

# **New and Updates**

### **Outreach**

During the quarter, FSPPM's outreach team continues putting effort into two important research projects"

- The development of Ho Chi Minh City into an international financial center funded by Ho Chi Minh City Finance and Investment State-owned company (HFIC). On May 8, 2020, Fulbright University Vietnam and Ho Chi Minh city Finance and Investment State-owned Company (HFIC) signed a cooperation agreement to design a Development Proposal to transform Ho Chi Minh City into a regional and international financial center.
- Toward a Big Urban Data Facility Computational Investigation of the Connectivity, Resilience and Demand of The Bus Network in Ho Chi Minh City granted by Vin Group Innovation Foundation. Some important updates of the project as below:
- The VINIF project team has been scraping and storing location data of all buses operational in HCMC since 12 May 2020 using the team's recently established Big Urban Data Facility (BUDF).
- Completed the first of the project landing page (https://budf.fulbright.edu.vn/en/) and a visualization of real time bus locations

- Completed a graph model for topological analysis of the bus network, which was used in identifying corridors in the existing network that are critical to maintaining its connectivity
- Completed the design and coding of the extension of the above graph model to explicitly account for timetable





On 23 June, FSA representatives joined the Alumni Happy Hour reception organized by the United State Consulate in HCMC, where they engaged in an informative exchange with Ambassador Dan Kritenbrink on issues relating to the 25th anniversary of Vietnam and the US, especially the success and contribution of the State alumni to strengthening the mutual relationship.

On 26 June, the topic *Experiences of alumni during the thesis writing process;* and *Re-integrating into community after graduation shared* by **Ms. Nguyen Thi Thanh Uyen** (MPP8), **Mr. Vo Thanh Trung** (MPP20-LM), and **Mr. Nguyen Quang Huy** (MPP20-PA).





# **Conferences and Seminars**



On May 30, 2020, **Mr. Do Thien Anh Tuan** participated the Southern Key Economic Region Conference (SKER). The event was attended by the Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Ministers, Ministers, and leaders of the eight provinces of the SKER. At the conference, Mr. Tuan presented the topic Cooperation Frameworks for the Southern Key Economic Region analyzing the institutional bottlenecks for regional integration, especially the investment budget for the region.

On May 20, **Dr. Vu Thanh Tu** participated in a panel discussion on Business Intelligence Briefing on Vietnam's Economic Recovery organized by AmCham Vietnam. According to Dr. Tu Anh, as Vietnam was able to control the Covid-19 from the early state, the country is having opportunities to attract new wave of FDI as many global companies are speeding up the process of diversifying investment locations to disperse risk and increase resilience to sudden fluctuations such as Covid-19.

Policy webinars on Covid-19 pandemic by FSPPM faculty is scheduled biweekly from April to June. The policy series is a knowledge initiative aiming to disseminating expert analysis on government policy responses to the general public. Four policy webinars were organized during the quarter:

- On 29 May, Coping Covid-19: Support or Stimulus? Where does the money come from? presented by Mr. Do Thien Anh Tuan
- On 15 May, Oil Price Crashes Amidst the Covid-19 Pandemic presented by Dr. Le Thai Ha
- On April 17, Crisis management: A perspective in response to Covid-19 presented by Prof. Pham Duy Nghia
- On 3 April, Government policy response to Corona virus Pandemic presented by **Dr. Vu Thanh Tu Anh**

### July
