Course Objectives

By the end of this course, students should be able to

Course Description

Class will meet three times per week. Each session is devoted to verbal and listening exercises designed to familiarize students with vocabulary and grammar useful in general settings. Although the intermediate and upper intermediate classes share a syllabus, instruction and textbooks in each class will be modified to respond to students' varying abilities. Class instruction will be in English only.

Requirements

Students are required to attend every class session, participate actively in class, and complete all assignments on time.

Final grades are calculated as follows:
