

The Two Faces of Asia

The Challenges:

- Half the world's population, majority of the world's poor
- 62% of the world's hungry
- 70% of undernourished children
- 16 of 21 of the world's mega-cities
- 60% of all large-scale natural disasters


The Opportunities:

- Fastest growing region; 1 billion middle class
- Three of the four largest economies in the world
- By 2025, trade volume expected to almost double (led by China, India, Vietnam, Indonesia)
- By 2050, Asia-Pacific expected to almost double its share of global GDP (from 27% in 2010 to 51%)
- Budding democracies, emerging regional partners taking on development role

USAID'S COLLABORATION WITH VIETNAM

- 1989 Disabilities programming through Patrick Leahy War Victims Fund and the Displaced Children and Orphans Fund
- **2000** Bilateral Trade Agreement Signed. Start USAID Support for Trade Acceleration (STAR) Programs
- **2004** Vietnam becomes 15th PEPFAR Focus Country
- 2005 Agreement for Economic and Technical Cooperation signed
- **2007** USAID/Vietnam Representative Office established
- **2010** USAID/Vietnam reaches full Mission status


