Teaching Team

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Objectives

By the end of the course, students will

- be able to communicate in English with confidence in everyday conversations
- be familiar with formats of academic articles
- develop basic vocabulary in economics and public policy
- be able to work in groups to create a policy memo

Course Description

Class meets three times per week. One of the sessions each week is devoted to reading materials from the Development Policy course or to developing communication skills essential for studying and working in public policy environment. The purpose of this is to familiarize students with academic readings and at the same time develop student's ability to communicate effectively.

Students will develop vocabulary in economics, management, and finance through different class activities which involve reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Because students are expected to submit a policy memo at the end of the course, a certain amount of class time will also be devoted to helping students with the process of writing and creating the memo in groups.

Although the intermediate and lower-intermediate classes share the same syllabus, instructions and text contents in the two classes will be modified to fit students' English levels and to facilitate students' learning process. Class instructions will be in English.

Requirements

Students are required to attend every class, participate actively in class, and complete all homework assigned by the instructors.

Final grades are calculated as follow:

Class participation: The School's class attendance policy is applied. Students are expected to make the most use of their class time, especially to boost their communication skills and vocabulary.

Mid-term exam: The mid-term exam is used to check students' progress. The test's contents will be based on what students have learned in class in the first six weeks. Test form TBA.

Final assignment: Students will be divided into smaller groups (4 members/group max). By the end of the course, each group will write a policy memo (1500-2000 words) in English. Students can use contents of their policy memos in the Development Policy course for this assignment.

Final exam: The final exam is a TOEFL-styled test. The last two sessions of the course will be devoted to familiarizing students with the test format.
