

From May 29 to June 4: The team project carried on a Field trip and consultative workshop to the Mekong Delta. The project's stakeholder consultation workshop brought together many representatives from the state management sector, the production sector (enterprises and farmer households), as well as relevant research units. There are many challenges mentioned when talking about climate change in the Mekong Delta, both from the research scholar's point of view as well as from the perspective of state management agencies and producers, such as the reduction of freshwater availability, the loss of normality of water flow and flood season of the Mekong River, unseasonal rains, sea level rise, land subsidence, river bank erosion, saltwater intrusion, reduction of sand extraction, dike problems, flood

In Q2/2022 the project team has continued the analysis of travel patterns of households in HCMC. In particular, the analysis aims to (i) cluster HCMC households based on their travel diary on a representative day and (ii) identify the demographic attributes most characterizing households in the same cluster. The analysis methodology combines unsupervised and supervised machine learning techniques that is novel in the research area of transportation science. The outcome of this exercise allows for a more methodologically sound approach to scaling of the information in a household travel survey for estimating of the travel demand of the whole population.
